A new exhibition by renowned Boston artist Shea Justice is now on view to the public at the New SPOKE Gallery in South Boston, the reception and gallery talk taking place on September 29th. Entitled *Scrolls of Justice*, the exhibition is the latest in a series of solo shows called Layered Time, in which Boston artists working in a range of media explore themes of time and its passage. Kathleen Bitetti is the Curator of the Layered Time series.

Justice will exhibit several of his scrolls, many of which are hundreds of feet long, that provide the artist's singular creative response to war, politics, current affairs, pop culture, and social and racial justice.

Layered Time is a series of four solo exhibitions connected thematically by how each artist incorporates facets of time into their work. The three additional artists featured solo are David Lloyd Brown, Naoe Suzuki, and Allison Maria Rodriguez.
